CREATE A GARDEN RETREAT

It's a known fact that surrounding yourself with plants and trees and working with your hands in the soil is very good for your overall health and well-being. Here are some things to consider when you are planning your outdoor landscape.

1. Pick plants that have more than one season interest. (Flowers in Spring, nice looking foliage during Summer, great Fall color or ornamental seed heads during Winter.
2. Use annuals. These are great for adding all Summer splashes of color. They are low maintenance once planted and easily changed the next season.
3. Have a hard surfaced area such as a deck or paver patio. A good rule of thumb is you need 50 square foot per every person that you plan on having at one time on a patio or deck.
4. Consider installing hard surfaced or stone paths on heavily travelled paths around the house. This will prevent mud and grass to be brought into the house.
5. Plant deciduous trees on the south side of a patio so you will receive sun in late Fall through early Spring. Standing or sitting in the sun can make you feel 20 degrees warmer so this will extend the time you can enjoy being outdoors.
6. Add a fire pit or fountain. Watching a fire or listening to the sound of water can be very relaxing.
7. Place a bench next to a scented garden. Herbs or plants with aromatic foliage can be very stimulating.
8. Have some covered area so on rainy days you can still barbecue or just sit and watch the rain.

9. Keep maintenance in mind when choosing plants. Shrubs planted at the right spacing in the right location, with a little mulch can have very little maintenance. On the other hand, overgrown shrubs and a mismatch of

perennials can become a maintenance nightmare.

10. Don't overdo it if you are doing all the work yourself. Start small and work your way into it as you gain experience and knowledge.

SUMMER- FLOWERING BULBS

We are offering Summer-flowering bulbs this year! We will have a variety of colors to choose from when picking out your Dahlias, Gladiolus and Callas. We thought it would be nice to provide you with an educational piece to assist you with your Spring planting.

Flowering bulbs are easy to care for and add beautiful color and texture to the garden. The term "bulb" often refers not only to true bulbs (like daffodils and tulips) but also to plants with tubers, corms, and rhizomes.

There are two main types of bulbs: Spring and Summer. Spring bulbs, also known as hardy bulbs, are planted in fall and flower in Spring. Spring bulbs can be planted as soon as the ground cools and night temperatures are around 40-50 degrees. You can plant Spring bulbs up until the ground begins to freeze. These bulbs can be left in the ground to flower year after year. Some of the best-known Spring bulbs are tulips, irises, daffodils, hyacinth, allium and crocus. We carry all of these Spring favorites in the Fall – be sure to visit us in September and October to see our selection!

Summer bulbs, also known as tender bulbs, are planted in Spring after the soil has warmed. They flower or leaf out in the Summer. Gladiolus, lilies, and caladiums are common examples of summer bulbs. Tender bulbs cannot survive cold winter temperatures and must be dug up each fall. That extra step is well worth it for the beautiful display of blooms in the Summer! We will have several varieties of Dahlias, Gladiolus, and Calla Lilies and can't wait for you to check them out! A few favorites that you will definitely want to try: Dahlia 'Café Au Lait,' Gladiolus 'Pastel Mix,' and Calla Lily 'Zazu.'

Planting Tips:

- When planting bulbs, choose a spot with well-draining soil. Drainage is necessary to keep bulbs from rotting.
- Plant in clusters for greater visual impact.
- Plant a combination of early, mid- and late-season bloomers to extend the season.
- Layer plant heights from front to back when planting varieties that bloom at the same times.

NEW VARIETIES



Helenium (Sneezeweed) 'Red and Gold Mix'

Helenium is a perfect daisy-like perennial to compliment the blooms of the Summer and Fall garden. It begins blooming in mid-Summer and continues through early Fall. Its plentiful blooms come in shades of red and golden-yellow, and are a favorite of butterflies and pollinators. Helenium is a nice addition as a border in a garden, and also makes for great cut flowers. Plants can be pinched back in June to reduce their height and encourage stronger, sturdier plants. This variety prefers full sun and performs best in a moist, rich soil. It grows to a height of about 35-47" with a spread of 18-24". Deadhead spent flowers to encourage blooming, and enjoy the beautiful display of red and gold from Summer through Fall!



Celosia Kelos® Series

Celosia is such a stunning annual - its blooms are like no other! We will be offering two spectacular colors from

the Kelos® series. Celosia 'Atomic Violet' has vibrant purple, feathery plumes above deep green foliage. Its unique texture is an exciting addition to garden beds and containers. It grows to a height of about 18" with a spread of 15". With a similar height and spread, Celosia 'Fire Red' is just as eye-catching with its large, bright red plumes. It also makes a beautiful border or mass planting in beds, and fills in containers wonderfully. Celosia prefers full sun, and has good drought-tolerance. Add either Celosia variety to your beds or containers for unique texture and rich color!



Portulaca Pazzaz™ Series

Portulaca is a heat and drought-tolerant annual with colorful blooms and succulent-like foliage. New this year are two varieties from the Pazzaz™ Series that are sure to add a pop of color to your containers, baskets, and beds! 'Mega Orange' has plentiful, bright orange blooms and 'Mega Pink Twist' has two-toned blooms of yellow and fuchsia-pink. Each variety grows to a height of 14-16" with a spread of 16-18". It has a semi-trailing habit, so it is a nice addition to a hanging basket or trailing from a container. It thrives in full sun and tolerates hot, dry spots very well. Include the Portulaca Pazzaz™ Series in your containers or beds for thrilling color!

FRESH HERB PASTA SALAD

INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups broccoli florets
- 2 carrots sliced
- 1 tbsp. Olive oil
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 tsp pepper
- 1/2 cup toasted pine nuts
- 1 lb. Fusilli pasta
- 2 oz parmesan cheese

HERB DRESSING

- 1/2 cup basil
- 1/3 cup oregano
- 3/4 cup parsley
- 3 cloves garlic
- 2 scallions (white part only)
- 1/4 cup red wine vinegar
- 2/3 cup neutral oil (avocado, safflower, grapeseed)
- 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp pepper

DIRECTIONS

Preheat oven to 425 degrees. Spread broccoli and carrots on a roasting pan. Drizzle with olive oil, salt, and pepper. Roast until vegetables are lightly browned and tender, about 12-18 minutes then set aside to cool. As vegetables are roasting, bring 4 cups of water to a boil. Once boiling add pasta and 1 tbsp salt. Cook until just tender, about 9-12 minutes. Drain and transfer to a large bowl. Add 3/4 of the dressing to warm pasta, stir to soak up the dressing. Add the vegetables and the rest of the dressing, cover and chill 2-4 hours. Serve with toasted pine nuts and parmesan cheese.

THE PERFECT SHADE GARDEN

Looking for something to plant in that shady part of your property that is easy to grow, low maintenance and tolerates very dry conditions? Plant Hostas. Hostas come in many different sizes, flower colors, and leaf shapes. If you pay attention to sizes, give them enough space, and use a variation of foliage colors, you can create a garden that is not only interesting and appealing but is also very low maintenance and tolerant to harsh weather conditions.

For a beautiful Hostas garden follow these simple rules:

Rule #1 Plant largest Hostas in back or center of the bed. Use these as specimen plants. Allow at least 4' between these and other Hostas. Some good varieties of these are:

- Sum and Substance- Yellow leafed variety which is good for brightening up deep shade
- Blue Angel- one of best blue varieties
- Earth Angel- large blue with a gold edge
- Sieboldin elegans- old favorite blue with very large leaves
- Victory- green with white edge

Rule #2 Next plant medium Hostas. These can be planted in groups of three to make a statement. Yellow leaved varieties will tolerate more sun and really brighten up a garden. Some examples of these would be:

- Halcyon- the best blue variety
- August Moon- best yellow variety
- Drinking Gourd- very interesting coarse veined foliage, curled forming a vase.
- Fragrant Blue- very fragrant flowers in August that can be used for a cut flower.

- Vulcon- white center with green edge
- Aureo marginata- old favorite with green leaves with a gold edge
- June- leaves that change color throughout the season with blue flowers.

Rule #3 Plant low Hostas around borders. Use 6" varieties in small gardens and 12" in larger gardens. Some examples of these are:

- Blue Mouse Ears- very small heart shaped blue leaves on very dwarf plants
- Autumn Frost- new variety with gold center with a green edge
- Patriot- Green leaves with very prominent white edges
- Wide Brim- low mound with white edge

Rule #4 Leave dead foliage until early spring. This will protect plants during winter. Install 2" layer of mulch in spring to keep unwanted weeds from sprouting and to help retain soil moisture.

2023 PERENNIAL PLANT OF THE YEAR



Rudbeckia 'American Gold Rush' with Schizachyrium Scoparium (Little Bluestem)

'American Gold Rush' is an exciting new hybrid of Rudbeckia that has bright yellow flowers with reddish halos and contrasting dark chocolate cones. It grows 22-27" tall and if given the room will grow up to 40" wide.

Gold Rush is resistant to leaf spot disease which causes black spotting on the leaves and premature seasonal decline on other Rudbeckias. Gold Rush is a butterfly magnet and its abundant seed production provides food for many songbirds throughout the Fall and Winter. Planting Gold Rush with perennial native grasses such as Little Bluestem creates an interesting garden bed with very little maintenance.

2022 Perennial – Schizachyrium Scoparium (Little Bluestem Grass), Full sun, Zone 3-10

2021 Perennial – Calamintha Nepeta – Full Sun, Zone 4-9

2020 Perennial – Aralia Sun King – Part Sun/Shade, Zone 4-8

2019 Perennial – Stachys monieri 'Hummelo' – Full Sun, Zone 4-8

2018 Perennial – Allium 'Millenium' – Full Sun, Zone 3-9

2017 Perennial – Asclepias tuberosa 'Butterfly Weed' – Full Sun, Zone 3-9

2016 Perennial – Anemone hybrida 'Honorine Jobert' – Full Sun/Part Shade, Zone 4-8

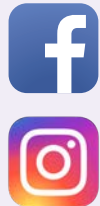
